Ensuring working zone is clear and tidy and has plenty of light. Ensure environmental conditions are suitable for the task (i.e. not raining) Instruction, information, training and supervision. 		
Electricity	Employees Electric shocks, burns and death	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Protective shoes with good grip to be worn at all times. Electrical items PAT tested annually. To be used only with an RCD. To avoid contact with water. Electrical equipment to be suitable for task. Good housekeeping to ensure leads cannot be damaged. Ensure environmental conditions are suitable for the task (i.e. not raining) Instruction, information, training and supervision. 		
Water	Employees Muscular skeletal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Protective shoes with good grip to be worn at all times. Goggles and gloves to be worn whilst using pressure washer. Ensuring any electrical cables to be kept out of water. Instruction, information, training and supervision. 		
Equipment Misuse	Employees Muscular skeletal, electric shocks, skin damage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Protective shoes with good grip to be worn at all times. Goggles and gloves to be worn whilst using pressure washer. Follow PUWER regulations http://www.hse.gov.uk/pUbn/ps/ps/pw/pw.pdf and http://www.hse.gov.uk/work-equipment-machinery/pw/pw.htm Instruction, information, training and supervision. 		

Working Alone	Employees Muscular skeletal, electric shocks, skin damage and death	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No working alone permitted 		
Cement	Employees Ingestion, inhalation, injection and absorption injuries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Face mask to be used while using. • Goggles and gloves to be used while using. • Protective shoes with good grip to be worn at all times. • To protect clothing wear coveralls. • Do not ingest products. 		

Ensure the work area is left clear and tidy at the end of the job to ensure the safety of staff and visitors returning to work after the weekend.

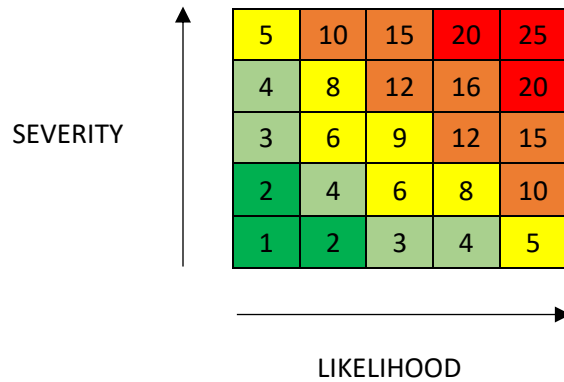

HOW TO CALCULATE A RISK RATING



Likelihood	Severity
1 = extremely unlikely	1 = very minor injury
2 = unlikely	2 = first aid injury
3 = possible	3 = lost time injury
4 = likely	4 = hospital treatment
5 = very probable	5 = disabling injury

Risk rating	Action and timescale
15 and above	Unacceptable Work may not start. Additional controls must be introduced to reduce risk rating to below 9.
9-14	Tolerable Additional controls must be introduced as soon as possible.
5-8	Tolerable Additional controls may be needed
4 or below	Acceptable

1-4 =	Low risk
6-9 =	Medium risk
10- 25=	High risk
