Manual Handling	Employees and contractors  Crush Injuries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Gloves and safety boots to be worn during the move</li> <li>Ensure the working zone is clear and tidy and has plenty of light and space</li> <li>Plan the route and brief all involved of the route before the task</li> <li>Ensure all people involved are physically fit to do the work required</li> <li>Lifting aids to be used when possible</li> <li>Instruction, information, training and supervision</li> </ul>	L	

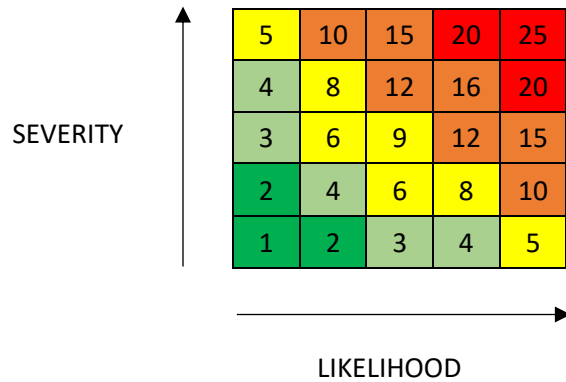
Being trapped or crushed when moving large items (e.g. carousel)	Employees  Crush, broken bones, death	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Good clear instructions given</li> <li>• Use of marshals to assist in movement</li> <li>• Good communication throughout</li> <li>• Ensure area is clear of trip hazards</li> <li>• Instruction, information, training and supervision</li> </ul>	L	
Cold Weather	Employees and contractors  Hypothermia and Frost Bite	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Limit time spent working in cold conditions by taking regular breaks</li> <li>• Warm drinks available</li> <li>• Wear warm clothing</li> <li>• Use available heating</li> <li>• Instruction, information, training and supervision.</li> </ul>	L	
Traffic in Car Park	Employees and visitors  Muscular skeletal injuries, broken bones, crush injuries and death	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cordon off the area</li> <li>• Wear high visibility clothing</li> <li>• Use appropriate signage</li> <li>• Use Banksmen to monitor and direct traffic</li> <li>• Isolate the working area where possible</li> <li>• Instruction, information, training and supervision</li> </ul>	L

## HOW TO CALCULATE A RISK RATING



Likelihood	Severity
1 = extremely unlikely	1 = very minor injury
2 = unlikely	2 = first aid injury
3 = possible	3 = lost time injury
4 = likely	4 = hospital treatment
5 = very probable	5 = disabling injury

Risk rating	Action and timescale
15 and above	<b>Unacceptable</b> Work may not start. Additional controls must be introduced to reduce risk rating to below 9.
9-14	<b>Tolerable</b> Additional controls must be introduced as soon as possible.
5-8	<b>Tolerable</b> Additional controls may be needed
4 or below	<b>Acceptable</b>

1-4 =	Low risk
6-9 =	Medium risk
10- 25=	High risk
